

Chapter 2

Alaska Boroughs and Census Areas

Introduction

This chapter presents detailed estimates of population by age, race, and sex for Alaska's boroughs and census areas. It also provides comprehensive analysis of geographic variation for population trends, households, components of change, and population composition.

Boroughs and Census Areas

As of July 1, 2016, the state had 19 organized boroughs, which are equivalent to counties in the rest of the United States. The three types of boroughs vary by the services they provide and their relationships with city governments.

The Municipality of Anchorage, the City and Borough of Juneau, the City and Borough of Sitka, and the City and Borough of Wrangell are unified home rule municipalities, where the city government and borough government are merged.

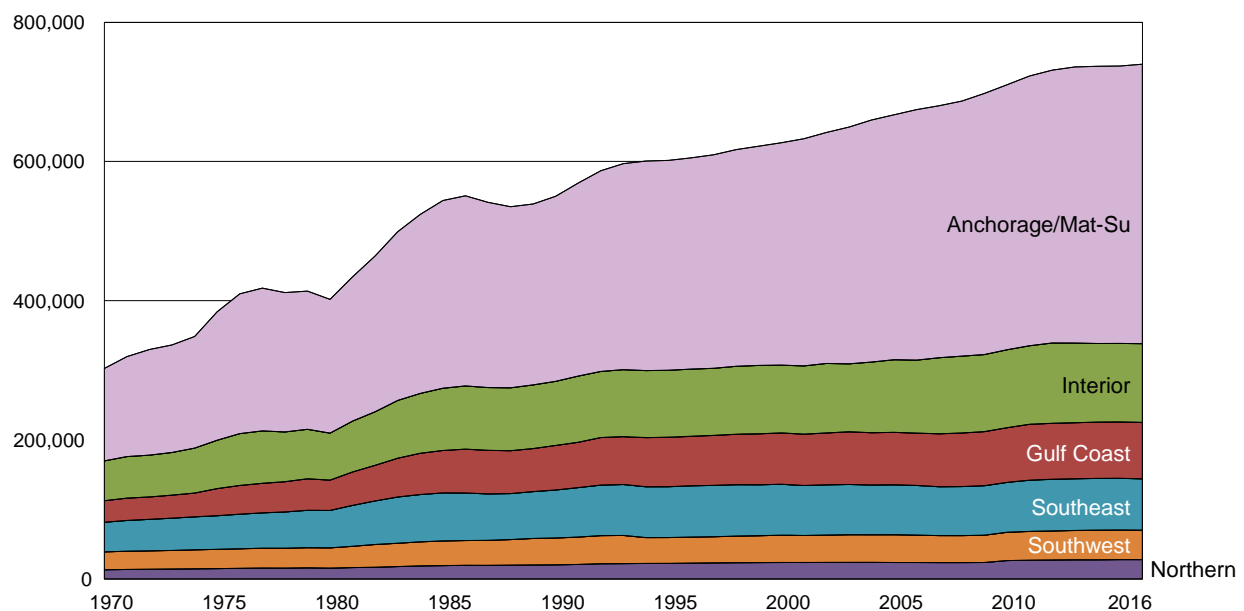
The other two types are distinguished by the level of services

they are mandated to provide. These remaining 15 boroughs are not unified, and although most contain organized cities within the borough boundaries, some do not. Bristol Bay Borough, Haines Borough, the Municipality of Skagway, and the City and Borough of Yakutat contain no incorporated cities.

The U.S. Census Bureau divides the remaining unorganized territory, which accounts for about 56 percent of the state's land area, into 10 census areas for statistical purposes. Although these are only statistical units, the federal government considers them county equivalents. Most census area boundaries follow Alaska Native Regional Corporation (ANRC) and Regional Educational Attendance Area (REAA) boundaries. All of the census areas contain incorporated cities.

Due to new borough formations and boundary changes over the years, it is not always possible to make direct historical comparisons for each area. Maps of boroughs and census areas at the time of each decennial census are available upon request and are also on the Alaska Department of Labor and Workforce Development's Research and Analysis Web site (laborstats.alaska.gov).

There were a few major boundary changes in the late 2000s and early 2010s. In 2007, the Municipality of Skagway was formed out of part of the Skagway-Hoonah-Angoon Census Area. The remaining area is now the Hoonah-Angoon Census Area.

The City and Borough of Wrangell was formed in 2008 out of the Wrangell-Petersburg Census Area and part of the former Prince of Wales-Outer Ketchikan Census Area. The remainder of the former Wrangell-Petersburg Census Area was renamed Petersburg Census Area.

The Ketchikan Gateway Borough annexed what remained of the Outer Ketchikan Census Subarea in 2008, except Hyder. The Prince of Wales-Outer Ketchikan Census Area was renamed Prince of Wales-Hyder Census Area.

Petersburg Borough incorporated in January 2013, replacing the former Petersburg Census Area and further changing the boundaries of Hoonah-Angoon Census Area and Prince of Wales-Hyder Census Area.

All numbers presented here are based on the Census Bureau's 2016 geographic boundaries. In 2015, the former Wade Hampton Census Area was renamed Kusilvak Census Area. Its boundaries remained the same.

Population Trends

Alaska's growth has been strong but varied over recent decades. Most growth has been in the state's urban areas, as

shown in Figure 2.1, which illustrates how the Anchorage/Matanuska-Susitna Region's population has become increasingly dominant.

In 2016, 80 percent of Alaska's population was in the following five boroughs: Municipality of Anchorage (40 percent), Matanuska-Susitna Borough (14 percent), Fairbanks North Star Borough (13 percent), Kenai Peninsula Borough (8 percent), and City and Borough of Juneau (4 percent). Figure 2.2 compares the growth rates of these boroughs by decade back to 1960.

Population growth in Alaska has been uneven over the last 30 years. Between 1980 and 1985, the state grew at an average annual rate of 6 percent. During the economic bust between 1985 and 1990, the state only grew an average of 0.2 percent annually. For the 1990 to 1995 period, Alaska grew by an average of almost 2 percent a year. Between 1995 and 2000, the rate slowed to just under 1 percent. From 2000 to 2005, the rate was steady at 1.2 percent per year on average, which picked up toward the end of the decade to reach an average of 1.3 percent annually between 2005 and 2010.

The state's population grew by 0.7 percent on average each year from 2010 to 2016, with the majority of growth in the Anchorage/Matanuska-Susitna Region. The Matanuska-Susitna Borough's growth rate was the fastest at an average of 2.3 percent annually during the past six years, more than three times the statewide average. Population growth was also strong in Kusilvak Census Area (1.5 percent), Municipality of Skagway (1.5 percent), and Bethel Census Area (1.0 percent).

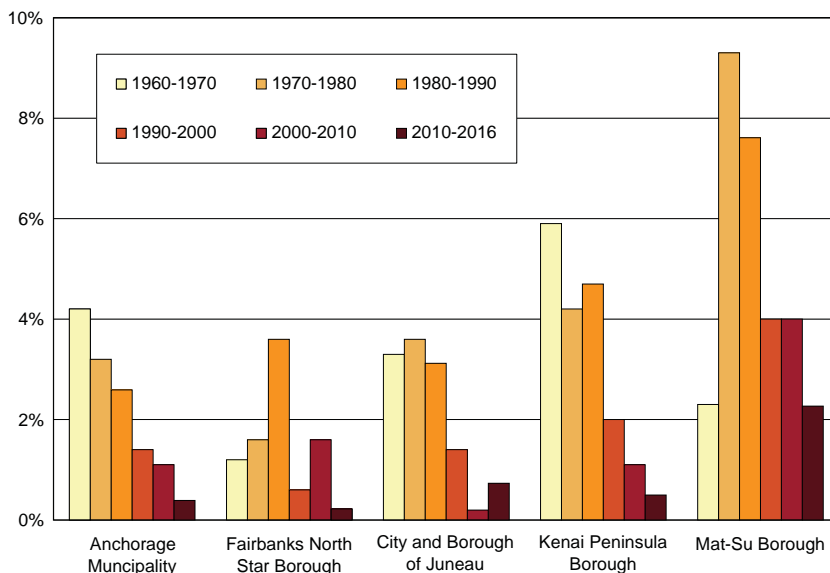
In contrast, the boroughs and census areas with the greatest population losses during the same period were the Bristol Bay Borough (-2.1 percent), City and Borough of Yakutat (-1.7 percent), Aleutians East Borough (-0.7 percent), and Yukon-Koyukuk Census Area (-0.4 percent). (See Table 2.1.)

Population Density

Overall, Alaska's land area is 16 percent of the entire United States. In 2016, Alaska averaged 1.3 people per square mile, in contrast to 91 people per square mile nationally. These numbers can be misleading, however, because high rates of federal, state, and Native land ownership — in addition to limited accessibility — preclude settlement on much of Alaska's land mass.

The Municipality of Anchorage's population density was by far the highest in Alaska in 2016, at roughly 175 people per square mile. Anchorage was followed by the Fairbanks North Star Borough at 13 and the City and

Borough of Juneau with 12. The lowest population density was in the Interior Region, with the Yukon-Koyukuk Census Area having 0.04 people per square mile. Fifteen boroughs and census areas had population densities of less than one person per square mile.

Some borough and census area populations live within a small part of their total geographic area, so population densities in settled areas may be considerably higher than that of official boundaries. For example, most of the population of the Matanuska-Susitna Borough is concentrated in the area between the Matanuska and Little Susitna rivers. Population density in that area is much greater than that of the entire borough, which averages four people per square mile.

Group Quarters

As Chapter 1 describes, the Census Bureau recognizes two categories of group quarters facilities: institutional (such as prisons, nursing homes, or military barracks) and noninstitutional (such as rooming houses, group homes, college dorms, emergency shelters, or logging and fish processing bunk-houses).

In 2016, an estimated 27,848 people — or 3.8 percent of Alaska — lived in group quarters, up slightly from 26,352 people

(3.7 percent) in 2010. Tables 2.2 to 2.8 provide household and group quarters data for all boroughs and census areas.

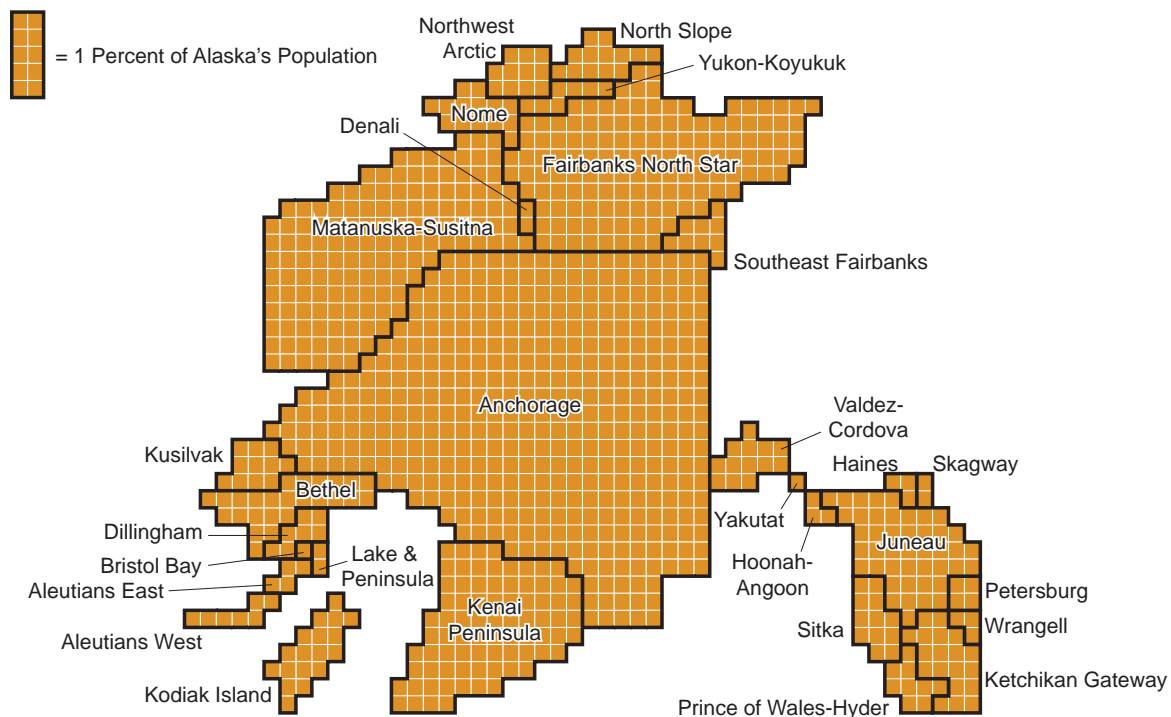
In 2016, 46 percent of Alaska's group quarters population lived in the Municipality of Anchorage and Fairbanks North Star Borough. Military barracks, University of Alaska dormitories, State of Alaska correctional facilities, a combination of profit and nonprofit group homes and nursing homes, and homeless shelters made up the population of group quarters in more populated areas.

The Aleutians East Borough and Aleutians West Census Area continue to have very large group quarters populations connected with fishing and the seafood processing industry, with 50 percent of their combined total population in group quarters in 2016. The Aleutians East Borough had the greatest proportion at 58 percent, followed by the Aleutians West Census Area at 46 percent.

The North Slope Borough had an estimated 2,660 people (27 percent of its total population) in group quarters in 2016. This was primarily due to 2010 Census counts of employees at remote work sites in the borough who were not counted at the sites in previous censuses.

Other areas in the state with relatively high shares in group quarters were Southeast Fairbanks Census Area (5.5 percent),

Fairbanks North Star Borough (5.0 percent), and Northwest Arctic Borough (5.0 percent). Group quarters in Southeast Fairbanks Census Area and Fairbanks North Star Borough are largely military. Fairbanks North Star Borough is also home to a large number of college students in dormitories. Mining accounts for the group quarters population in Northwest Arctic Borough.

Housing Units and Households

A household includes all people who occupy a housing unit, which can be a house, an apartment, a mobile home, a group of rooms, or a single room that is occupied as separate living quarters. Tables 2.2 through 2.8 provide household data for Alaska boroughs and census areas.

The number of households (occupied housing units) in Alaska in 2016 was estimated at 263,814, an increase of 5,756, or 2 percent, since 2010. The state's number of people per household edged up from 2.65 to 2.70.

Areas with larger household sizes are in the northern and western areas of the state. In 2016, these included Kusilvak Census Area with an average of 4.19 people per household, followed by Northwest Arctic Borough (3.80), Bethel Census Area (3.60), North Slope Borough (3.49), and Nome Census Area (3.37).

The smallest households were in Bristol Bay Borough with 1.99 people on average, Denali Borough (2.03), Municipality of

Skagway (2.04), Haines Borough (2.07), and the City and Borough of Wrangell (2.16). Southeast Alaska is well-represented on the list of small household sizes, as its population is older so fewer households include children.

Components of Population Change

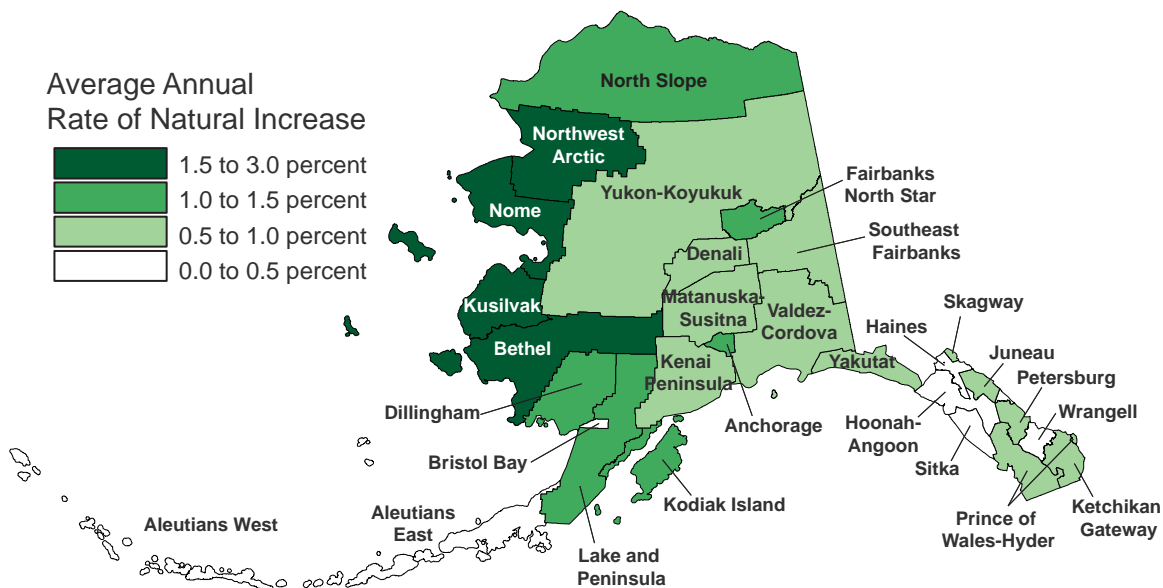
Population change has two parts: natural increase, which is births minus deaths, and net migration, which is in-migration minus out-migration. These components of change are presented in Table 2.9, which also includes birth and death rates for each area. (Also see Figures 2.4 and 2.5.)

The major population centers had the largest total population increases between April 2010 and July 2016. Matanuska-Susitna Borough gained the largest number of people during that period at 13,603, followed by the Municipality of Anchorage (+7,211), Kenai Peninsula Borough (+2,660), and City and Borough of Juneau (+1,464). The areas that lost the most net population between 2010 and 2016 included Aleutians East Borough (-140), Valdez-Cordova Census Area (-136), Yukon-Koyukuk Census Area (-129), and Bristol Bay Borough (-123).

Births and Deaths

The April 2010 to July 2016 average annual birth rate for Alaska was 1.6 births per 100 people, equal to the average annual birth rate for 2000 to 2010 and above the national rate of 1.3 from 2010 to 2016.

The highest birth rates were in areas with higher-than-average numbers of Alaska Natives. The Kusilvak Census Area had the highest average annual rate from 2010 to 2016 with 3.0 births per 100 people. Other areas with high rates included Bethel Census Area (2.5), Northwest Arctic Borough (2.4), and Nome Census Area (2.4).

Birth rates were lowest in the Aleutians and Southeast Alaska. Aleutians East Borough and Aleutians West Census Area, where nearly two-thirds of the population are male, had average annual rates of 0.5 and 0.6 per 100, respectively. The lower-than-average birth rates in Southeast Alaska are related to the relatively old age of the population there. Haines Borough had an average annual birth rate of 0.8 per 100 people from 2010 to 2016.

Alaska's average annual death rate was 0.6 per 100 people from April 2010 to July 2016, slightly higher than the rate from 2000 to 2010, which was 0.5. The death rate is closely related to age and is expected to increase over time as Alaska's median age increases.

The boroughs/census areas with the lowest average annual death rates in the state from 2010 to 2016 were the Aleutians East Borough and the Aleutians West Census Area, which had rates of 0.2 and 0.3 deaths per 100 people, respectively. The state's highest death rates were in the Yukon-Koyukuk Census Area (1.0), the City and Borough of Wrangell (0.9), and Bristol Bay Borough (0.9).

Migration

Migration is made up of in-migration and out-migration flows. Net migration is in-migration minus out-migration for a given place. The total volume of population turnover due to migration (in-migration and out-migration) is called gross migration.

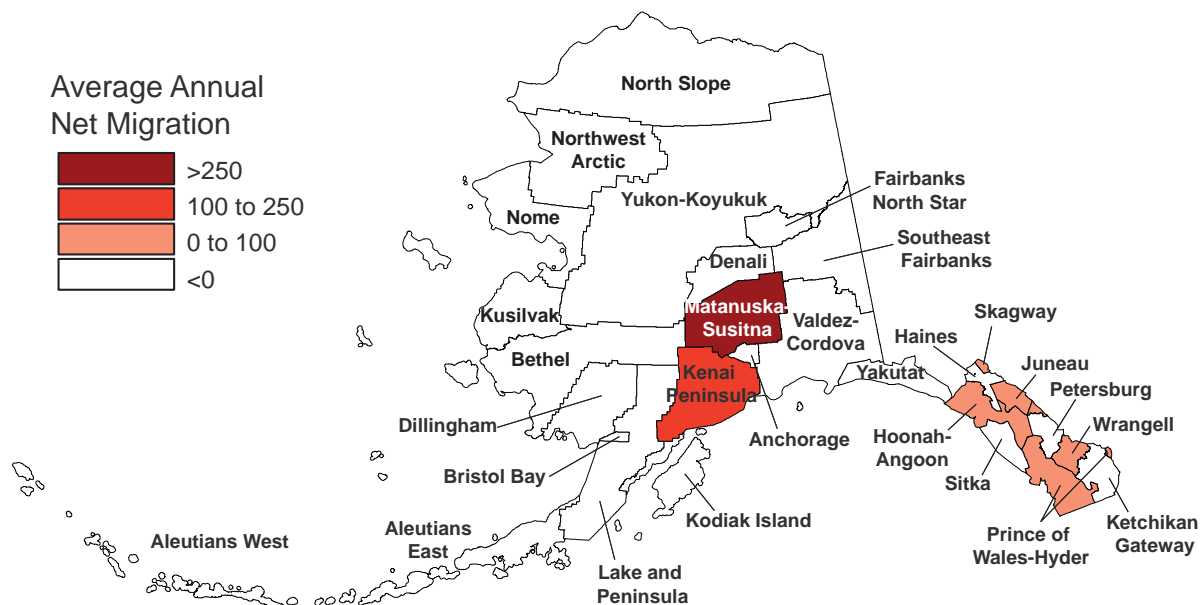
Although Alaska hasn't had dramatic net migration gains in the past couple of decades, it has one of the nation's highest rates of population turnover from migration. There are large migration flows within the state as well, particularly to and from the state's major population centers. From 2015 to 2016, five of Alaska's six economic regions had net migration losses to the sixth region, Anchorage/Mat-Su.

The highest average annual rate of net migration (or rate of change in population size due to migration) from 2010 to 2016 was in the Matanuska-Susitna Borough at 1.4 percent. The Municipality of Skagway had the next-highest rate at 0.9 percent.

The boroughs and census areas with the highest rates of loss due to net migration from 2010 to 2016 include City and Borough of Yakutat and Bristol Bay Borough at 2.5 percent of the total population per year.

Some areas have high rates of population loss due to net

migration but maintain their size through natural increase. An example is Fairbanks North Star Borough, which had an average rate of net migration loss of 1.0 percent per year from 2010 to 2016, yet the total population grew by 1 percent during the same period.

Proportion Alaska Native

Boroughs and census areas in the Southwest, Northern, and Interior regions have the highest proportions of Alaska Natives. (See Figure 2.6.)

As described in Chapter 1, respondents were able to select more than one race on the 2000 and 2010 Census forms, so there are at least three measures of population by race: race alone, race alone or in combination with other races, and “bridged-race.” Bridged-race data, which are available upon request, provide estimates for population by race in which all respondents are assigned a single race. Also, tables noted “modified race data” in this publication include the adjustment for “some other race” (described in Chapter 1).

The Municipality of Anchorage had the largest number of Alaska Natives alone (26,003) in 2016. The share of Anchorage’s total population that was Alaska Native was relatively low, though, at just 9 percent. (See Tables 2.10 through 2.16.) The area with the second-largest Alaska Native alone popula-

tion in 2016 was Bethel Census Area (15,127). Eighty-three percent of the area’s population is Alaska Native alone.

The five boroughs/census areas with the highest numerical increases in residents reporting their race as Alaska Native alone between 2010 and 2016 were the Municipality of Anchorage (+2,128), Matanuska-Susitna Borough (+1,815), Bethel Census Area (+1,002), Fairbanks North Star Borough (+608), and Kusilvak Census Area (+552).

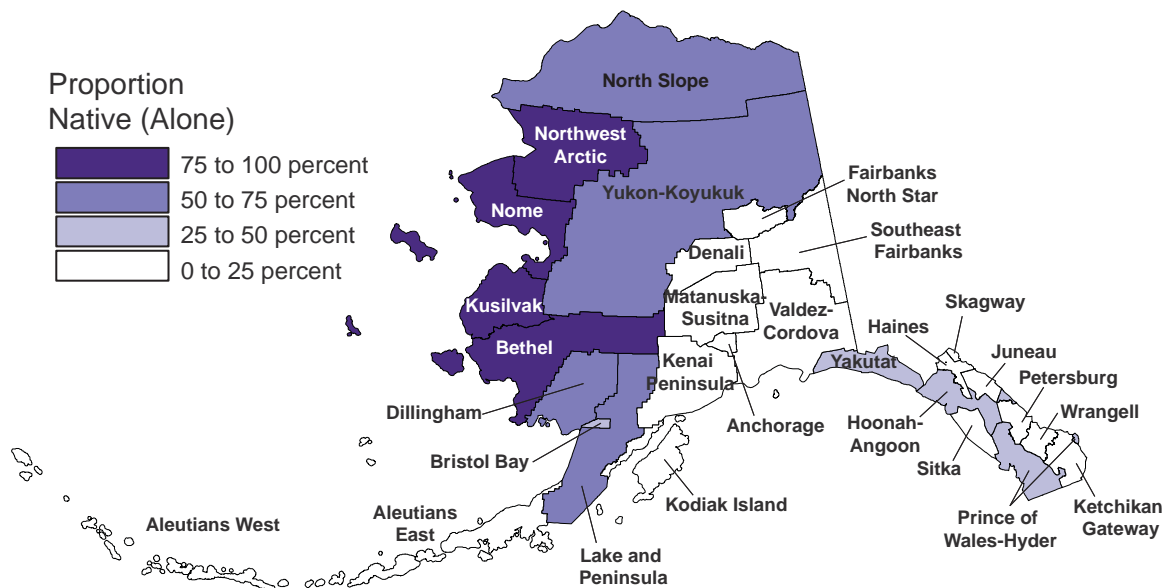
In 2016, 45 percent (50,332) of Alaska Natives (alone) lived in areas that were more than half Native.

Due to migration from rural to urban areas, the proportion of the Alaska Native (alone) population living in boroughs that were 10 percent or less Alaska Native alone grew to 40 percent in 2016, up from 38 percent in 2010.

Boroughs/census areas that were 10 percent or less Alaska Native alone in 2016 included Denali Borough (5 percent), Municipality of Skagway (6 percent), Matanuska-Susitna Borough (7 percent), Kenai Peninsula Borough (8 percent), Fairbanks North Star Borough (8 percent), and Municipality of Anchorage (9 percent).

Male-to-Female Ratio

The male-to-female ratio is the number of males per 100 females. In 2016, there were 107 males for every 100 females statewide. The boroughs and census areas with the highest male-to-female ratios were Aleutians East Borough (201 males per 100 females), Aleutians West Census Area (196), North Slope Borough (163), Denali Borough (123), Southeast Fairbanks Census Area (123), and Prince of Wales-Hyder Census Area (120). Many of these areas have large fishing and seafood processing industries or military, oil and gas, or mining, which all have proportionately more men.

The boroughs and census areas with the lowest average male/female ratios were Haines Borough (97), City and Borough of Sitka (101), Municipality of Anchorage (102), Ketchikan Gateway Borough (103), City and Borough of Juneau (103), and the City and Borough of Wrangell (104). In general, urban areas and areas with older populations tend to have lower male-to-female ratios.

Median Age

Alaska's median age was estimated at 34.7 as of July 1, 2016, an increase from 33.8 in 2010. As discussed in Chapter 1, Alaska's population is aging roughly in line with the trend throughout the United States. The U.S. median age was 37.9 in 2016, up from 37.2 in 2010.

The Alaska areas with the oldest median age as of 2016 were Haines Borough (49.5), City and Borough of Wrangell (47.9), Hoonah-Angoon Census Area (47.2), Bristol Bay Borough (44.9), and City and Borough of Yakutat (44.4).

The youngest median ages in 2016 were in the Northern and Southwest regions of the state. These areas included Kusilvak Census Area (23.7 years), Bethel Census Area (27.1), Northwest Arctic Borough (27.6), Nome Census Area (28.3), and Dillingham Census Area (29.7).

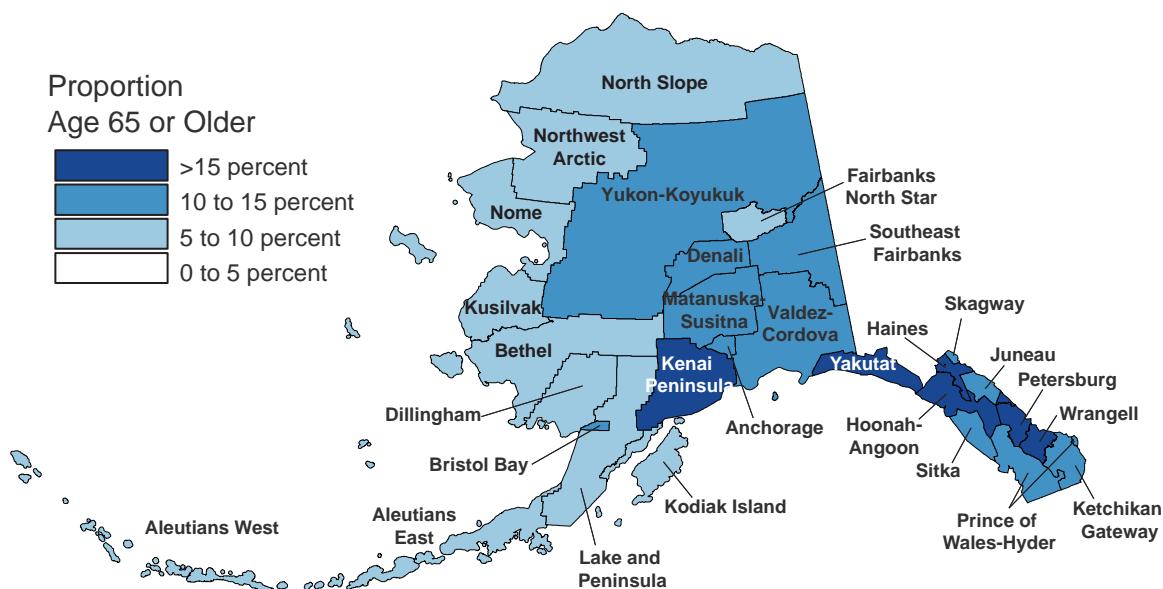
The largest increases in median age between 2010 and 2016 were in the City and Borough of Yakutat (+4.7 years) and Haines Borough (+2.6). The largest decreases were in the North Slope Borough (-1.3 years) and Valdez-Cordova Census Area (-0.7).

Seniors

The proportion of the state population aged 65 and older was 11 percent in 2016. The older population steadily increased from 3 percent in 1980 to 4 percent in 1990, then up to 6 percent in 2000 and 8 percent in 2010. Although Alaska still has the smallest percentage of people aged 65 and older among states, it is following the nationwide aging trend.

Some parts of Alaska had a higher concentration of older Alaskans than others. Southeast was highest. Haines Borough

led the state with 20 percent, followed by City and Borough of Wrangell and Hoonah-Angoon Census Area with 19 percent each and Petersburg Borough with 17 percent. (See Figure 2.7.)

Other Southeast areas with a higher-than-average percentage were City and Borough of Yakutat with 15 percent, followed by City and Borough of Sitka, Ketchikan Gateway Borough, Municipality of Skagway, and Prince of Wales-Hyder Census Area with 14 percent.

Areas outside Southeast with relatively large shares of seniors were Kenai Peninsula Borough (16 percent), Yukon-Koyukuk Census Area (13 percent), and Southeast Fairbanks Census Area (13 percent).

North Slope Borough, with its large group quarters population, had one of the lowest shares of seniors in 2016, at just 5 percent. Other areas with relatively few older Alaskans included Kusilvak Census Area (6 percent), Bethel Census Area (7 percent), Northwest Arctic Borough (7 percent), Aleutians East Borough (7 percent), and Nome Census Area (7 percent).

In 2016, 81 percent of Alaska seniors lived in the following areas: Municipality of Anchorage (38 percent), Matanuska-Susitna Borough (14 percent), Fairbanks North Star Borough (12 percent), Kenai Peninsula Borough (12 percent), and City and Borough of Juneau (5 percent). Many senior citizens choose or need to live in urban areas, where medical care and other necessities are more accessible.
